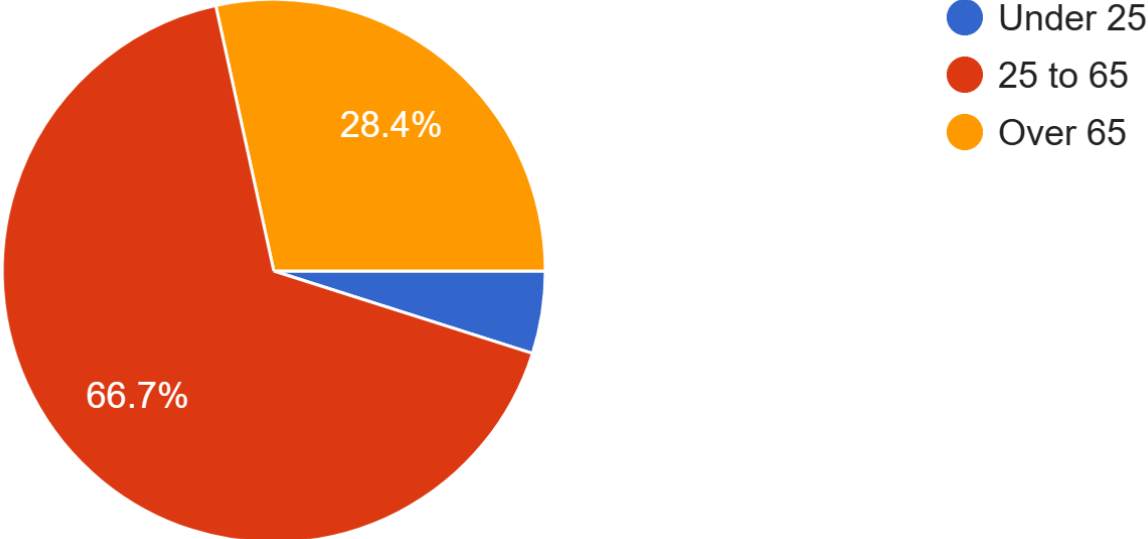

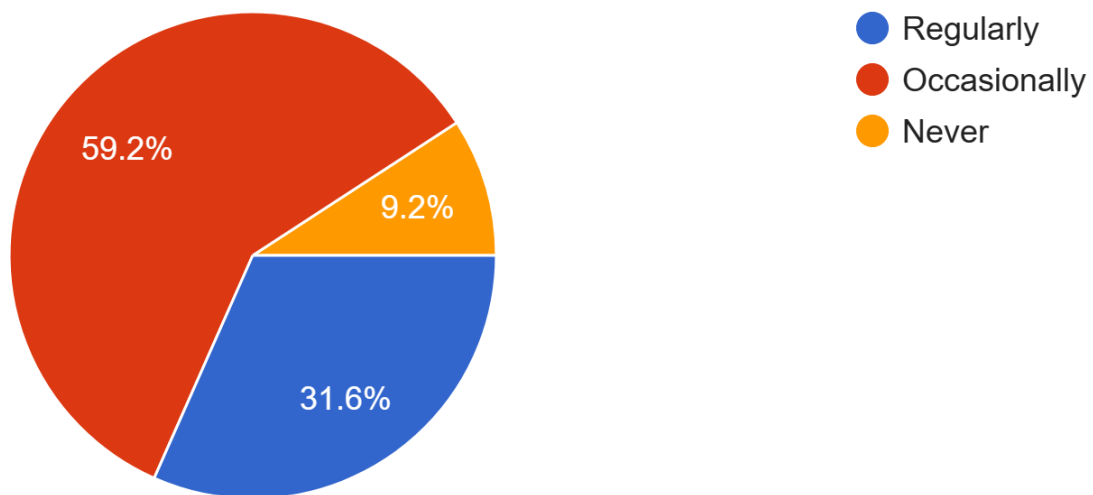

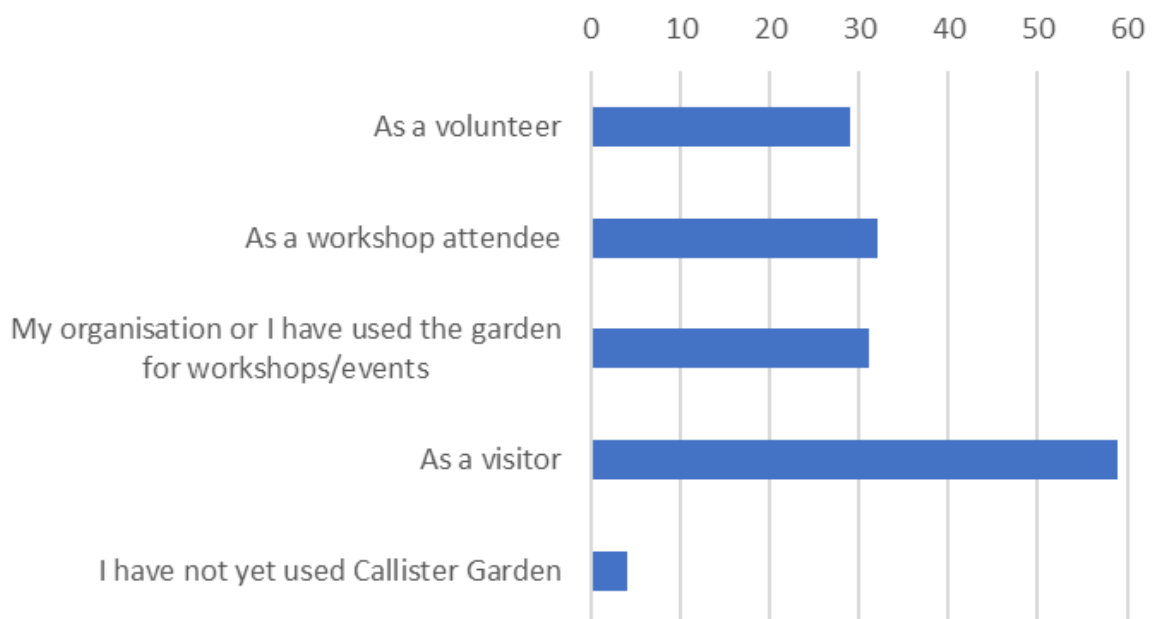
# How often do you use Callister Garden?

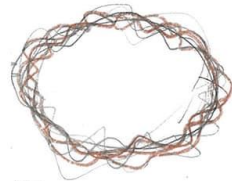

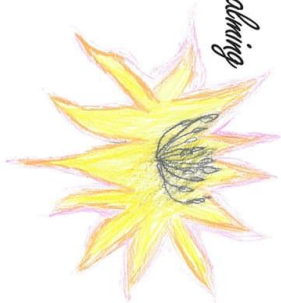


I love painting

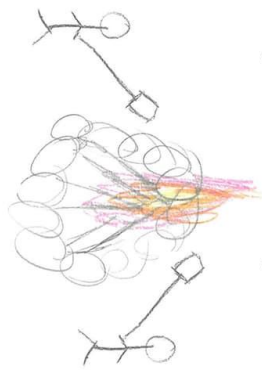

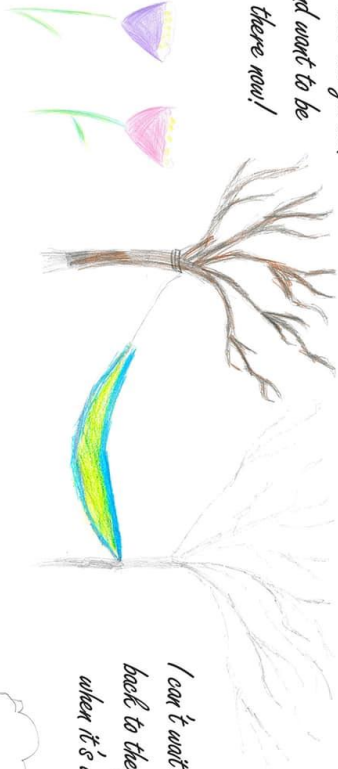
I loved the weaving

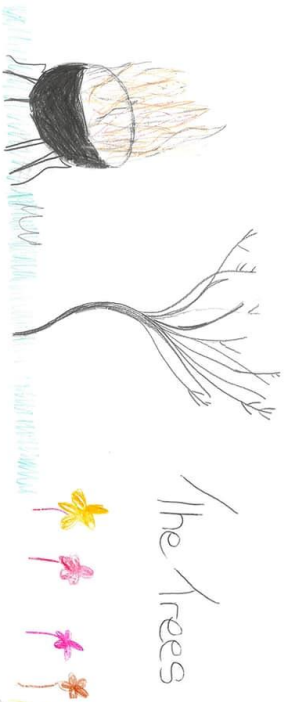
